

Flexible Filly SLOW FEEDER MUZZLE

Each package comes with 10 low-profile zip ties to secure the muzzle to your halter

A soft, flexible, comfortable, effective and safe muzzle option for horses!

This patent pending design allows horses to graze lightly or eat grain slowly while feeling free and comfortable. It's open system allows for maximum air flow. The soft material keeps teeth and equine lips free from hard surfaces. Its flexibility reduces the risk of horses getting "hung up" on anything. It is rated to break before your leather turnout halter.

Two sizes:

Large: Fits horse to oversize

Medium: Fits pony to smaller horse size

Package contains Flexible Filly Slow Feeder Muzzle and 10 zip ties to secure to your halter

Use the low profile zip ties to attach to halter. Trim away excess zips and straps with scissors

For use with a traditional turnout halter

Specifically designed to allow maximum air flow while limiting grazing and slowing speedy eaters

Flexible and more comfortable

Flexible muzzle material is rated to break just before your leather turnout halter

Keeps horses from feeling confined. Soft material prevents tooth wear and sores on lips and gums

Aids in minor cribbing problems!

Fitting: Attach with triangles to either side of the horse's face. This helps provide extra air flow

Tips for applying your new muzzle.

Two of the "fins" have a triangle cut out. These go to the square (side) rings on your turnout halter. Secure each side fin with one of the enclosed low profile zip ties. Do not wrap the fins around the halter, doing so may cause rubs. After finding the best fit for your horse, simply trim the excess fin material. The fins (legs) of the muzzle need to be trimmed just above the top hole being used. As you can see in this image. The horse is comfortably grazing with the excess material and so it is fine to wait a bit to ensure your muzzle is a comfortable distance from your horse's mouth prior to trimming. Fit the sides (the pieces with the triangular cut out) so that it's JUST BARELY touching the horse's mouth and then attach the other 6 accordingly. When you are satisfied with the fit, make sure the "keeper" on the zip tie is on the outside and the excess is facing down and trimmed close.

If you find there is too much grazing room be sure your fins are snugly secured to your halter. If the fins are set at appropriate distances from each other and the muzzle is the correct size it should work famously!
